Sensei Harris is a professional Educator who teaches the Arabic and French languages. Gralyn has been a world class competitor for more than 25 years, beginning as a High School All-American Wrestler '76 and continuing through becoming the Senior National Masters Judo Champion '94. His contributions to martial arts include promoting the spread Judo across America and the Middle East; from helping establish the University of Connecticut Judo Club in 1978 to helping create and establish the Ganbaru Judo Yudanshakai (USJF) in California; to sponsoring the Junior National Judo Championships in Yemen and, most recently, helping to establish the West Point Judo team as one of the top two Judo Teams in American Collegiate Judo. His success as a coach includes training several National High School and Collegiate Judo Champions and place winners '88; '91; '93; 94; '03; 04; 05.
